
Treasures of Tutankhamun – Latest

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TOMB AFTER TOMB OF AMAZING DISCOVERIES REVEALED!

DUST-encrusted archaeologists today abseiled gingerly down through the foetid air of an ancient spiral staircase into the ancient subterranean necropolis of Ben-Gazzara.

There for the first time since 1922 they shone sand-choked torches into what is believed by experts to be Tutankhamun's ancient Department of Trade and Industry, or possibly ancient DVLC.

TREASURES FROM THE TOMB

According to Egyptologist Mortimer van Dijk, mile after mile of ancient labyrinthine corridors, which criss-cross the stygian gloom deep beneath the hot swirling sands, could one day yield an unprecedented ancient horde of rich fragments and/or Aladdin's Cave of fascinating shards.

Meanwhile, an ancient piece of papyrus reed, over an inch long and more than likely crafted about 1361 BC into the shape of a vulture's knee, was carefully dusted off.

It stood as unbelievably mute witness to what perhaps were once the ancient workings of The Necropolitan Water Board or North Nile Gas.


Both probably worshipped richly painted vultures, or at any rate finely chiselled shegoats, and surely must have stashed their fabulous takings somewhere round here.
